Calumpit-Clark ROW issues cleared



CITY OF SAN FERNANDO – The right-of-way in six critical areas from Calumpit, Bulacan to the Clark Freeport Zone has been secured by the Department of Transportation to speed up the completion of the North-South Commuter Railway (NSCR) System.

This, flowing President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.'s directive to the DOTr to streamline land acquisition process for big-ticket transport projects to expedite construction of critical infrastructure aimed at easing the plight of commuters.

"We extend our gratitude to the local government units in these critical areas where we will construct the NSCR, particularly those in Angeles City, Mabalacat City, City of San Fernando, Apalit, Minalin, Sto. CAMPUS BOMB THREAT HOAXES



Cops arrest minor

ANGELES CITY – Police have apprehended a minor suspected of having posted online bomb threats against various campuses here and in other towns of Pampanga.

With his parents, the suspect was brought on Oct. 13 to the Office of the Mayor for a case conference with Mayor Carmelo "Jon" Lazatin II, city police director Col. Joselito Villarosa, Jr., social workers from the city social welfare and development office, and a representative from the Public Attorney's Office.

Under Presidential Decree No. 1727, anyone who willfully makes a bomb threat or disseminates false information about bombs via any medium, including social media, faces imprisonment of up to five years, a fine of up to ₱40,000, or both, with no bail.

Villarosa, said that guardians may also bear responsibility if proven they neglected their child's well-being or failed to exercise proper supervision. This, he noted, underscores the principle that there are repercussions for

every action and that accountability extends to families responsible for safeguarding youth.

Mayor Lazatin reminded the public that online posts and comments about threats are taken seriously and carry potential legal consequences. 'This accomplishment highlights the ability of law enforcement to trace online communications and hold offenders accountable, regardless of age, while also emphasizing rehabilitation and restorative processes for juveniles," the mayor noted. NBI nabs **SHS** student

ANGELES CITY – A 21-year-old senior high school student has been arrested by the National Bureau of Investigation-Region 3 as the prime suspect behind the bomb threat at the F.G. Nepomuceno Memorial High School here.

The NBI-3 said suspect Sheila Gonzales used a dummy Facebook account with the name "Miles Manunulat" in sending bomb threat to the school which turned out to be a hoax.

It can be recalled that on Oct. 9, Pampanga 1st District Rep. Carmelo "Pogi" Lazatin, Jr. sought the assistance of NBI in identifying the perpetrators behind the false bomb threats targeting schools in the First District.

Lazatin congratulated

the NBI-3 headed by Atty. Renoir Baldovino for a "job well done."

This, even as he warned other perpetrators of the bomb threat hoaxes to immediately stop their activity. "With NBI onboard, you will be arrested."

The NBI was assisted by Pandan Barangay Captain Cors Alejandrino and staff in arresting Gonzales.

Sfelapco spokesperson Atty. Cathy Diaz said the move is part of the company's safety measures to protect electrical lines and prevent accidents. She explained that strong winds can blow away tarpaulins or streamers, which may cause short circuits, power interruptions, or even fires.

Diaz added that unregulated advertising materials also obstruct road visibility and worsen traffic

Fund resilience, not disasters

AS THE climate crisis accelerates, disasters are multiplying and amplifying - devastating lives and livelihoods, erasing decades of development gains in an instant. The cost to the global economy is staggering: an estimated \$2 trillion every year, when indirect costs are taken into account.

Yet funding to reduce repercussions remains dangerously low. Just 2% of development assistance and often less than 1% of government budgets are dedicated to disaster risk reduction. That's not just a gap - it is a miscalculation. Every dollar invested in resilient infrastructure in developing countries saves \$4 when disasters strike.

The theme of this year's International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction reminds us of the imperative to fund resilience. Governments and donors must scale-up investments in disaster risk reduction. The public and private sectors must integrate risk into every decision - to reduce exposure and vulnerability to hazards. And resilience must be embedded into the foundations of development.

On this day, let's commit to meet surging risk with a surge in funds, and build a safer and more equitable future for all.

Lumublob sa maputik na tubig para luminis

"KUNG TAYO man ay maging taksil, mananatili pa rin siyang tapat. Sapagkat hindi niya maikakaila ang kanyang sarili." Ito po ang mabuting balita na ibig ko sanang pagnilayan natin, ngayong umaga. Mga salitang makapagbibigay sa atin ng lakas ng loob na lumapit at humingi ng tawad sa Diyos sa kabila ng ating mga pagkukulang at pagkakasala, dahil likas sa Diyos ang manatiling tapat at maging mapagpatawad. At iyon din kasi ang ibig niyang matutunan natin sa kanya: ang maging tapat, dahil nilikha niya tayong kalarawan niya, at mga anak ang turing niya sa atin.

Minsan may nagtanong sa akin tungkol sa ating unang pagbasa. Bakit daw nag-uwi ng lupa galing sa Israel si Naaman sa kanyang bayan sa Syria matapos na siya ay gumaling? Ano daw ba ang ibig sabihin noon? Balikan natin ang kuwento. Binabayaran sana ni Naaman ng ginto ang propetang Eliseo matapos na maglublob siya sa maputik na ilog ng Jordan, na ayaw niya talagang gawin noong una. Para kasing nasaktan ang pride niya dahil hindi siya binigyan ng importansya ng propeta kahit meron siyang endorsement mula sa hari at mataas na opisyal na militar siya ng bayan ng Syria. Biro nyo nagpaabot lang ang propeta sa kanya ng salita: na lumublob nang makapitong beses sa maputik na tubig ng ilog Jordan kung ibig niya gumaling. Dahil sa galit, uuwi na sana ang heneral. Mabuti na lang at napigilan siya at naimulat ng kanyang alipin na dalagitang Israelita: "Ano po ba ang mawawala sa inyo kung sumunod kayo at magpakumbaba?" Nang lumamig ang ulo ng heneral, sumunod nga siya. Ginawa niya ang utos ng propeta at aba—gumaling siya! Luminis

Balik tayo sa tanong: bakit nag-uwi siya ng lupa matapos na tanggihan ng propeta ang alok niyang gantimpalang ginto? Ang lupa ay simbolo ng pagpapakumbaba—sino nga ba tayo para magmalaki, e galing lang tayo sa lupa at babalik

Mga kapatid, mga kapwa Pilipino. Ito po ang dahilan kung bakit bilang presidente ng CBCP, naglabas ako ng isang pambansang panawagan na tayong lahat ay manalangin, magpakumbaba at magsisi sa mga panahong ito ng napakaraming kalamidad at trahedyang nangyayari sa ating bayan. Gumawa tayo ng simbolikong paglulublob sa maputik na tubig ng korupsyon na lumulunod sa ating lipunan. Kung ibig nating luminis na muli at gumaling ang ating bayan sa ketong ng katiwalian. Magpakumbaba tayong lahat.

Alam nyo, minsan may isang matandang ale na lumapit sa akin para humingi ng payo. Bakit daw kaya sunod-sunod ang pagdapo ng mga kamalasan sa buhay niya? Ang pinakahuling kamalasan na tinuturing niya ay noong pinatay ang apo niyang lalaki na graduating na sana sa college at pinaghirapan niyang paaralin. Tinanong ko siya, "Bat nyo naman naisip na minamalas kayo?" Sabi niya, "Kasi parang pinaparusahan ako ng Diyos." Dahil nakita kong mabigat ang kalooban niya at humihingi siya ng tulong na makalag ang tanikalang gumagapos sa konsensya niya, binanggit ko sa kanya ang tatlong sangkap ng pakikipagkasundo sa Diyos: pag-amin, pagsisisi at pagbabayad-puri.


Mabilis na sinabi ng ale, "Inaamin ko po na noong una, kapag nakakarinig ako ng mga adik na tinotokhang at pinapatay nang kasagsagan pa ng giyera sa droga, wala akong pakialam. Tuwangtuwa pa nga ako dahil, inisip ko na tama lang na mabawasan ang mga salot sa lipunan. Minsan nga nakita ko talaga iyung kapitbahay namin, hindi naman nanlaban noong kinaladkad sa kalsada, binaril talaga siya kahit nagmamakaawa. Pero tumahimik ako, hindi ako tumestigo. Kaya nga siguro ganoon din hinayaan ng Diyos na mangyari sa apo ko. Naisip ko, "Hindi kaya pinalalasap sa akin ng Panginoon ang naranasan ng kapitbahay

Sabi ko sa kanya: "Pwede ninyong tingnan bilang parusa. Pero pwede rin ninyong tingnan bilang paraan ng pagmumulat ng Diyos sa inyo dahil mahal niya kayo." Naghahagulgol siya.

Minsan katulad ng ale, kapag sunod-sunod ang pagdapo sa atin ng trahedya at kalamidad, parang natutukso rin tayong mag-isip na minamalas tayo o pinaparusahan tayo, o galit sa atin ang Diyos. Sabi ni Santo Tomas de Aquino, minsan hinahayaan ng Diyos na mangyari sa atin ang isang bagay na masama kung may idudulot ito na mas higit pang kabutihan. Katulad ng sampung ketongin sa ating ebanghelyo. Kaya siguro naitanong ni Hesus nang bumalik ang isa - "Di ba sampu ang gumaling? Nasaan ang siyam?" Kasi noong maysakit pa sila ng ketong, sama-sama sila kahit magkakaiba sila ng mga paniniwala: ang siyam ay Hudyo at ang isa ay Samaritano. Totoo, hindi ba, sa gitna ng kalamidad, nakakalimutan natin ang ating mga hidwaan. Hindi Katoliko, Protestante, Iglesia o Muslim; hindi pula o berde, pink o dilawan sa pulitika ang nakikita mo, kundi kapwa tao. Kaya kung minsan maituturing ding parang blessing ang mga kalamidad—nagiging okasyon ang mga ito para lampasan ang ating mga pagkakaiba, para matuto tayong magdamayan. Para matuto tayong magpakumbaba, umamin ng ating mga pagkukulang, lumublob sa maputik na baha ng korapsyon ng lipunan na hinayaan nating maghari. Magsisi, makiisa sa pagkukumpuni, sa pagbabayad-puri, sa muling pagbubuo ng wasak nating lipunan, sama-samang maituwid na muli ang bumaluktot na kultura, tumalikod sa kasinungalingan at katiwalian, at matutong manindigan sa tama, matutong maging tapat, humingi ng tawad sa mga panahon na nakiisa tayo sa hindi tama, nakitawa tayo sa mga nagmumura sa Diyos, sa mga pumapatay sa kapwa, sa mga walang pakundangan sa dangal at dignidad ng tao.

Hindi naman po galit ang Diyos. Tapat pa rin siya. Sabi nga ni San Pablo: kahit magtaksil tayo, mananatili pa rin siyang tapat dahil hindi niya maikakalla ang kanyang sarili. Hindi niya tayo matitiis. Ibig lang niya na matauhan tayo,mahimasmasan sa ating kahibangan, magsisi at magbalik-loob sa kanya.

Who stole our Chiz or shame?

Nights are getting longer these days, daylights shorter. The message is unmistakable: the longest season in the world has just begun, unofficially or otherwise, except perhaps the spirit, not withstanding that a Jose Mari Chan's popular tune is increasingly hummed.

People would prefer that darker days, metaphorically, gets shorter or far and few between, given the givens. We have had more than our share of natural and man-made tragedies, better metaphors are now or should be in great demand, or the horizon looks bleak. Metaphors, according to a poet, are tenacious,

It's should be given that most people, if not all, hope that our nation's priorities are taken care off. Of course, by the highest official, leader, if you like, of the land. Never mind the second highest official; she has something else more important in mind. The Constitution is clear on this: both the highest and the second are supposed to give justice to everyone and serve the nation. There is no doubt what either is doing right now, given the givens.

Good news for the Malacanang tenant and the nation: the most famous veep in this neck of the woods: sara Duterte says that it's pointless to ask the man on top to resign.

In fairness, with so much on the President's plate, probably unprecedented in Philippine history, it would be difficult to sort out from the myriad national concerns in their order of priorities, along with the frequent trips abroad of the spare

First things first. But what would that be for Marcos the Younger?

American author Steven Covey of "Seven Habits of Effective People" noted that leaders must be able to differentiate between urgent and important in addressing needs. Too often, , however, that is the pitfall of leaders trying to be effective as possible. Politicians are compromised by definition. Meaning: it's almost impossible for them to determine which is which at a given time or circumstance.

Times like this, pundits and philosophers can

come in handy. India'siconic leader Mahatma Gandhi said actions express priorities. The German philosopher Johann Wolfgang Goethe has a clearer paradigm: the most important thing must not be at the mercy of the least important. Covey says most of us spend too much time on what is urgent and spend less time on what is

Between now and 2028, ad the new mindset of the vice president, how much time does the President has to wrap things up nearly and nicely?

A better question: is President Bongbong Marcos spending more time on the problems of the victims of earthquakes, typhoons and flood problems and less time on other things which many consider needing his priority attention? Like keeping hi untilmself politically alive 2028. Anything beyond is ambitious, given the stark

For instance, it's now harvest season for many rice farmers in the country. The golden grains promise gold for farmers and their families. But the farmers see more losses than profits from the hard=earned, back-breaking livelihood. Palay prices are low and farmers want the government to improve it to the level of P20 per kilo for them to be happy about the season. Right now, traders are buying at 10 per kilo. Farmers cry shameless.

In the meantime, rice consumers, especially in calamity areas, housewives want the government to keep the price to P20 per kilo. And the government is doing it at a loss. In other words, the government is helpless to make both consumers and farmers happy. Many agricultural workers are losing their means of livelihood due to mechanization, low income from rice farming and rising land prices that tend to drive farmers away from their livelihood. Never has planting palay been more unhappy and lonely nowadays.



Sacred Heart Medical Center joins PhilHealth's YAKAP network









Filipinos, a cancer diagnosis often comes too late. But with Sacred Heart Medical Center (SHMC) now part of PhilHealth's YAKAP (Yaman ng Kalusugan Program), early detection may finally be within reach – without the financial burden.

Starting Oct. 20, SHMC will begin offering free cancer screening services under the YAKAP package, including tests for breast, liver, colon, and lung cancer. The initiative is part of PhilHealth's expanded primary care benefit, designed to catch illnesses early and reduce long-term treatment costs.

Cancer is largely preventable and treatable

when caught early," said Dr. Maria Josefina Tan SHMC's medical director. "This program allows us to reach more patients before the disease progresses."

YAKAP expands the earlier Konsulta (Konsultang Sulit at Tama) package to include more comprehensive diagnostics, streamlined patient navigation, and phased access to subsidized medicines under the GAMOT (Guaranteed and Accessible Medications for Outpatient Treatment) initiative.

At SHMC, patients can now avail themselves of free cancer screening under PhilHealth's YAKAP Program, including tests for breast (2D

mammogram and ultrasound), liver (AFP and ultrasound), colon (fecal test and colonoscopy), and lung cancer (low-dose chest CT).

To access these services, patients must register with SHMC at their YAKAP Clinic and undergo a first patient encounter (FPE) for a doctor's order.

For 58-year-old barangay health worker Lorna, the program is a game-changer. "Marami sa amin ang takot magpa-check-up dahil sa gastos," she said. "Ngayon, libre na. Hindi na kami maghihintay ng sintomas bago kumilos.'

SHMC's inclusion in the YAKAP network is especially significant for Central Luzon,

where access to specialized cancer care remains limited. With its advanced technology—including linear accelerators, breast tomotherapy, and imageguided therapy—the hospital offers a one-stop-shop model that reduces delays and improves outcomes.

Beyond diagnostics, SHMC provides a full-circle care approach: surgery, chemotherapy, radiation, pain and nutrition management, psychological support, and palliative care. Its close referral loop and patient navigation system ensure that patients receive timely, coordinated care.

While full GAMOT medicine

benefits are still being phased in outside the National Capital Region, SHMC currently offers 21 out of the 75 listed medicines under the program. Broader access is expected by 2026.

For Dr. Tan the launch is both a milestone and a mission. "We're not just treating patients we're building a culture of prevention. And that starts with making care accessible."

As PhilHealth continues to expand its YAKAP network nationwide, SHMC stands as a model of how public-private partnerships can deliver preventive, compassionate, and comprehensive care—one patient at a time.



Addressed to the Office of the President, Department Transportation, Civil Aeronautics Board, Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines, and the Department of Trade and Industry, the paper emphasizes the strategic urgency of reinstating the route to fuel regional growth, bolster foreign investment, and enhance ASEAN integration.

GROUNDED BY COVID

Before the global health crisis, the Clark-Kuala Lumpur route served as a crucial link between Central Luzon and Malaysia, a key ASEAN economic partner. Its suspension, a casualty of travel restrictions, border closures, and airline network consolidation, has yet to be reversed, even as other international flights have resumed.

According to the position paper, this lapse has created a void in trade access, tourism flow, and investment connectivity, particularly affecting business activity in Clark Freeport, New Clark City, and the broader Central Luzon region.

NEED FOR FLIGHT RETURN The proposal for

reinstatement cites six core arguments:

Economic and **Investment Opportunities:** With Malaysia showing growing interest in Central Luzon, a direct flight is critical to facilitate business visits, trade missions, and investment scouting, in line with the Bases Conversion and Development Authority's ongoing promotion of the Clark Freeport Zone and New Clark City.

2. Employment and MSME Development: Route restoration would generate employment across logistics, hospitality, and tourism, and open new market access for micro, small, and medium enterprises in Pampanga, Tarlac, Bulacan, and nearby provinces.

3. Stronger ASEAN Connectivity: The route aligns with the Brunei-Indonesia-Malaysia-Philippines East ASEAN Growth Area (BIMP-EAGA), supporting trade in manufacturing, agriculture, halal products, and services.

4. Support for Aviation Decentralization: The revival would ease congestion at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport, support the government's multigateway strategy, and make use of Clark International Airport's underutilized terminal, which has an annual capacity of 8 million passengers.

5. Tourism Boost: Kuala Lumpur's role as a transit hub for ASEAN, South Asia, and the Middle East makes the route a vital entry point for international travelers to Northern Luzon destinations like Subic,

Baguio, and Banaue. 6. Strategic Access for New Clark City: As the government aims to position New Clark City as a global investment hub, direct air connectivity is seen as essential for hosting diplomats, investors, and business delegations.

NATIONAL STRATEGIC IMPERATIVES

Beyond regional benefits, the position paper stresses that restoring the route would enhance the Philippines' standing within the ASEAN Economic Community, advance national tourism and infrastructure objectives, and solidify ties with Malaysia.

The paper calls for immediate action from multiple agencies:

1. DOTr, CAAP, CAB, the Clark International Airport Corp., and the Luzon International Premier Airport Development Corp., the CRK operator, are urged to initiate airline negotiations and offer regulatory support.

2. DTI, BCDA, the Department of Tourism, and the Philippine Export Zone Authority are encouraged to include the route in investment missions and promotional efforts.

3. The Department of Foreign Affairs and the Philippine Embassy in Malaysia are requested to coordinate with Malaysian counterparts.

4. Local government units nd business chambers in Central Luzon are asked to endorse the economic merits of the route.

TIMELY PUSH FOR RECOVERY

"The suspension of the Clark-Kuala Lumpur-Clark flight in early 2020 was a result of extraordinary global circumstances. Today, with economic activity recovering and investor interest rising, the Philippines must seize the opportunity to restore this vital link," the paper concludes.



The acting transport chief cited the strong support and cooperation of the Pampanga and Bulacan LGUs, while also lauding the efforts of the Right-of-Way and Site Acquisition (ROWSA) Team led by DOTr assistant secretary IC Calaguas for speeding up the process of land acquisition.

With the latest development, Lopez expressed confidence that all ROW requirements for the northern section of the NSCR's Malolos to

Clark will be completed by mid-2026.

For the southern section of the NSCR System, the DOTr is targeting to complete ROW acquisition for nine stations by December 2025, including those in Biñan, Cabuyao, Sta. Rosa, EDSA, Sucat, Muntinlupa, FTI, Blumentritt, and Sta. Mesa.

The agency is also fast-tracking the utility relocation of the NSCR's southern segment by December 2025, alongside the Banlic Depot, with

ROW acquisition already at 98 percent.

Some top legislators, the House Speaker and the Senate President, have quit. The public wants more purge from their ranks. PBBM can't just stay being a minimalist. Household names have to go, it's the least they can do to serve. The President can consider it a priority

conditions. They likewise make it difficult for linemen to access and repair electric posts and power lines during emergencies.

The city public order and safety coordination office (CPOSCO) clarified that permits issued by local government units do not authorize companies or individuals to post advertisements on power poles.

"Sfelapco does not allow advertisements on electric posts even for a fee because public safety is our priority," Diaz emphasized.

Sfelapco said that while commercial advertisements will be banned from electric posts, important local government announcements may be allowed, provided they

are installed properly and do not cause obstruction, safety hazards, or visual clutter.

The company urged businesses, organizations, and other unauthorized groups to voluntarily remove their materials before Sfelapco and CPOSCO start their joint cleanup operation.

CPOSCO said they are currently waiting for the expiration of the last batch of 30-day permits issued and will temporarily suspend the release of new

Once the remaining permits expire, Sfelapco and CPOSCO will begin removing and properly disposing of all unauthorized billboards, streamers, and posters.
