# 200 cabalens get P8-M Capitol medical assistance



CITY OF SAN FERNANDO -- The Provincial Government of Pampanga, under the leadership of Gov. Lilia "Nanay" G. Pineda and Vice Gov. Dennis "Delta" Pineda, extended ₱8 million worth of medical and financial assistance to more than 200 Kapampangans from various towns across the province.

The aid covers support for patients undergoing chemotherapy, dialysis, surgeries, and liver transplants, among other medical needs.

The governor and vice governor personally led the distribution of financial assistance at the Pampanga Capitol, where they also took time to

speak with each beneficiary.

The program forms part of the provincial government's ongoing commitment to deliver accessible and compassionate healthcare services to all Kapampangans, especially those in critical and vulnerable conditions.

Among the day's beneficiaries was five-year-old Scarlet, one of 47 chemotherapy patients who regularly receive financial aid from the Capitol. Scarlet was diagnosed with eye cancer two years ago, which led to the removal of one of her eyes after several chemotherapy sessions.

Touched by her story, Governor Pineda pledged to provide Scarlet

with an artificial eye, offering not just physical aid but also hope and renewed confidence for the young survivor.

"Sobrang salamat po Nanay sa tulong niyo sa anak ko," said Marlyn, mother of the cancer patient.

Assisting in the distribution were board members Fritzie David-Dizon, Cherry Manalo, Christian Halili, Dr. Kaye Naguit, and Maynard Lapid.

# DOTr fast tracks housing for settlers affected by NSCR project

# First 100 days: Cong Pogi distributes AKAP to 3,644 beneficiaries, cash aid to 317

ANGELES CITY – In his first 100 days in office, Pampanga 1st District Rep. Carmelo "Pogi" Lazatin, Jr. distributed assistance through the Ayuda para sa Kapos ang Kita Program (AKAP) of the Department of Social Welfare and Development to 3,644 beneficiaries and cash assistance to 317 residents.

# **Ensuring food** security, ending poverty for good

BY DESIGN perhaps, rather than mere coincidence, interrelated human issues find themselves one day apart in taking the spotlight in global consciousness.

On World Food Day, Oct 16., UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres messaged:

"Today, around the world, 673 million people still go to bed hungry every night. Many more face daily uncertainty about their next meal. Global progress is far too slow and, in some regions, reversing.

New challenges have emerged over the decades – from soaring obesity, to climate shocks threatening food security. Shamefully, hunger is being weaponized – we face the appalling reality of people in conflict situations being starved with famine taking hold.

This year's World Food Day theme - "Handin-hand for Better Foods and a Better Future" is a call for solidarity across borders, sectors and communities... Let us respond. Let us come together once again, to build food systems that nourish people and protect the planet."

On the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty, Oct. 17, the UN chief lamented: "Too often, people living in poverty are blamed, stigmatised, and pushed into the shadows. Yet poverty is not a personal failure; it is a systemic failure – a denial of dignity and human rights."

And again, called out "on us all to stop the social and institutional maltreatment of people living in poverty – and to honour the promise of the Sustainable Development Goals to eradicate poverty in all its forms, everywhere."

To do so, Guterres advanced the imperative for "policies that leave no one behind: affordable health care and housing; decent work and fair wages; universal social protection; food security; quality education; and financing that works for countries and communities."

Exhorting the world, thus: "On this International Day for the Eradication of Poverty, let's reject stigma and discrimination. Let's stand with people living in poverty, and act with solidarity to end poverty for good."

Ensuring food security to end poverty. The world has still a long, long, long way to go.

### Perseverance

FIRST OF all, I ask you to say a prayer for my country, the Philippines.

I left my country with a heavy heart. In these days, the people's anger over government corruption is growing. And when anger grows faster than justice, it can easily explode into violence — as has recently happened in Nepal and Indonesia.

So, I ask you: please pray for us, that we may find peace in truth and justice, not in blood.

I can somehow relate to the image in our first reading — of Moses, praying from a distance while his people are struggling in battle. That's how I feel right now: far away, with arms outstretched in prayer for our kababayans at home who—in addition to nonstop natural calamities of typhoons, floods, earthquakes, and volcanic eruptions, are also dealing with the even worse calamity of corruption and malversation of public funds worth trillions, that has severely eroded the nation's trust in government.

You know, when I was newly ordained 43 years ago, I used to extend my arms widely in orans position for the presidential prayers. I was like a bird preparing to soar up in the air, full of youthful energy and idealism. But as the years went by, it's like my arms grew heavier and heavier, and the arms' stretch in prayer getting narrower and narrower. I am therefore wondering why some young priests, whom I expect to still be in honeymoon stage, have already narrowed down their orans position like this—demonstrate gesture—so soon!

There come such times in your ministry when, even if you still want to pray and still want to believe, you find your arms like those of Moses, drooping from weariness.

And so I love this detail in the first reading that Moses did not pray alone. When his arms grew weary, Aaron and Hur stood beside him, one on the right, one on the left, to hold his hands steady until sunset.

That's our first lesson about perseverance: you don't persevere alone.

Faith is not a solo performance; it's a choir. We need others to keep us standing when our knees begin to tremble and our hands grow weak. Even priests, bishops, and cardinals need their Aarons and Hurs — people who hold them up when the burden of ministry becomes too heavy.

And if you think about it, even Jesus Himself had His own "Aaron and Hur" in the Garden of Gethsemane — Peter, James, and John. They fell asleep, all right, but they were there with him nevertheless. And even when they failed Him, He still loved them and believed in them.

So, if you ever feel tired in prayer or in service, remember: you are not alone. Perseverance is sustained by community. Don't ever behave like "lone rangers" whether in your life or in your ministry—if you want to survive.

Let me now draw a second lesson from our second reading, from Saint Paul's letter to Timothy. Paul says, "Be persistent, whether it is convenient or inconvenient."

What he means is: Don't give up just because the ministry begins to weigh on you. The strength to persevere doesn't come from sheer stubbornness or will power, but from the power of God's Word that lives in us.

When you let the Word take root in your heart, it becomes your strength in times of dryness, your compass when you lose direction, your light when everything feels dark, your fire when you're feeling cold.

I remember a time when I almost lost courage in my ministry, especially during those times when I felt like a voice in the wilderness. I felt like a miserable failure when many of our own Catholic faithful did not agree with our moral stand, such as against the killings during the bloody drug war of

the previous administration. Some of them were even supposed to be pro-life advocates. There were those times when witnessing to the Gospel became a very unpopular option; when in the midst of threats and persecution many of our own people responded with apathy and indifference. During those times it was the Word of God that kept me going.

You know, I have two daily habits: my walk with Mama Mary after dinner, and my coffee with Jesus early, in the morning. I am used to waking up early, making a cup of coffee and drinking it in my chapel while praying the lauds, reflecting on the readings for the day and preparing for my homily. I call it my intimate "Coffee with Jesus Moment." It has kept me going. That's when i hear echoes from the Scriptures that speak straight to my heart. Like the assuring words of Paul to Timothy in our second reading: "If we are unfaithful, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself." (2 Tim 2:13).

That verse has actually been one of my anchors. And maybe some of you have your own favorite verses that keep you going— a line of Scripture that carries you through life. I suggest that you hold on to it. That's how perseverance grows roots.

And now let's draw a third lesson, this time from the Gospel. Jesus tells us the parable of the persistent widow — a woman who didn't stop knocking on the door of an unjust judge until she finally got justice. I love her guts! If she were Filipina or Italian, she would be the kind of nonna who would not take a "no" for an answer.

But notice what Jesus says after telling the story: if even an unjust judge gives in to persistence, how much more will a loving Father listen to His children who cry out to Him day and night?

That's the secret of perseverance in prayer it's not born of desperation, but of relationship. We are not widows begging before an indifferent judge. We are sons and daughters speaking to a Father who loves us.

If you believe that your Father listens, you will not give up. You may cry, you may doubt, you may complain — but you won't stop trusting. That's why Jesus ends the story with a question that pierces the heart: "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" He's not asking if He will find busy churches or long novenas. He's asking if He will still find hearts that trust.

- So, what sustains perseverance? Three things: 1. Community — the people who lift your arms when you grow weary;
- 2. The Word which anchors your soul when faith wavers; and
- 3. Trust the quiet confidence that the Father listens and cares.

Let me end with the words of our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, in his recently published apostolic exhortation Dilexi te:

"Love, when it perseveres through fatigue, becomes prayer.

Love, when it refuses to give up, becomes light." (§24)

So, when your strength begins to fade and your arms begin to droop, remember Moses — and remember that God Himself, more than Aaron or Hur, stands beside you to keep your hands lifted, until the battle is won.

# The French have a word for it

A rocambolesque story.

It's a modern story that would have aptly, succinctly portrayed what has been dubbed as an unprecedented account of corruption in the Philippines.

In English, rocambolesque means extravavagant, fantastic, incredible, fabulous. Any adjective would have fit the extraordinary sad, shameful narrative to a T.

The French, and the rest of the French speaking world, would have said oui. -The late President Cory Aquino, who read and spoke fluent French but didn't flaunt it even at the constant prodding, begging of Press Secretary Teddy Benigno would have said the same thing. Or she could have said alternatively wa - oua, if you will, which means the same thing. She also understood Kapampangan, although it's doubtful if she was as fluent.

But it's not about the Philippine corruption story, although it's equally evil. In an imperfect or sinful word, chances are even, although theologians say, the ground at Calvary was level. Here, you would expect Sen. Joel Villanueva to agree, notwithstanding the allegations that he may be implicated in the scandal involving public works projects, vis-à-vis his faith profession and therefore denial, which ever comes first.

In the latest incident, the thieves, per report, presumably French masked as construction workers , completed the instant heist in less than 10 minutes, using modern tools and transport system. Stolen were inestimable values of jewels that go back to the French Emperor Napoleon I and his wife Empress Eugenie.

Legend has it that a thief known as rocambole who emerged from a 19th century adventure series repeatedly outwitted authorities and ran away with his loot.

The same wiliness ,meanwhile, characterized a nagging rot across the ocean, in the Philippine government. Those suspected of being deeply involved in massive corruption masqueraded themselves as legislators of both the House of Representatives and the Senate, government engineers implementing public works and business cum financiers.

It took years before no less President Bongbong Marcos found out about it. It helped greatly that Nature or Heaven, mainly flood one after the other, exposed it for the nation and the world to hear and know about it. As it happened, some legislators

and their accomplices were recidivists.

While the extent of the thievery in France has been stopped and assessed, the Philippine scandalous issue is not yet closed. In the first place, no one has been jailed yet. Due process has it's own downside, lawyers and legalese argue.

Public Works Secretary Vince Dizon says he's not yet through with the investigation and more could be uncovered. Many say the onus of the job job has affected Dizon is more ways than one. Not that he has a troubled and uneasy conscience as the 19th French author Victor Hugo would have commented the same way he wrote in Les Miserables. For Dizon, aggravations come from without, not from within.

In the Senate, Sen. J.V, Ejercito, the good one, couldn't fail but notice that Dizon has lost his poster boy image as a private sector executive, Ejercito knew whereof he spoke as private sector leader once. Sen. Rodante Marcoleta, who claims affinity with the Cabinet official as fellow Kapampangan is as sympathetic if not more, notwithstanding his controversial stand and the low opinion by a former Supreme Court justice about his being a legal luminary.

The robbery at the Louvre museum has blown the French la vie en rose to smitheeren, according to pundits, The worldwide humiliation from the heist has most especially hurt the French politicians and their brand of politics. Some say that something has to give sooner than later.

The same thing has thrown Philippine politics into chaos. Life, or bie as Kapampangans call it, is never the same again. The Speaker of the House and Senate President have quit. One congressman is on the lam. More are expected to be charged by INVESTIGATIONS in pursuit of potential rocamboles.

In particular, the special commission created by the President is expected to haul in like a rock net those involved in infrastructure scams involving billions of pesos in ghost projects, substandard works and even questionable lifestyles.

Plunder charges have been filed by former senator Antonio Trillanes against Sen. Bong Go,

# The politics of distrust

IMAGINE LINING up for a government permit that should take an hour or two, but somehow stretches into days; unless you know someone inside. Imagine going to a health center where there is no doctor, no medicine, and no explanation; only an overworked and underpaid nurse apologizing for something beyond her control.

Imagine paying your taxes from your hard-earned salary, believing they will fund classrooms, roads, and hospitals; only to discover they help fund a nepo baby's designer bag, luxury car or foreign trip.

Imagine a parent begging a public hospital for a bed for their sick child while lawmakers in Congress argue over who gets the bigger slice of the national budget.

Imagine watching a senator accused of corruption give a speech about honesty complete with Bible verses, and still get a standing ovation from his peers.

Imagine being stopped by a

traffic enforcer who isn't really looking for a violation, but for a bribe thinly disguised as "pangkape."

Now imagine all these small betrayals happening every day, everywhere, until they pile up into one painful question: Who can we still trust?

That's the question haunting millions of Filipinos today.

According to the 2024 Philippine Trust Index by EON Group and Ateneo, Filipinos say they trust leaders who are competent, consistent, and have good intentions. Yet, these qualities seem to be in short supply.

Local governments still enjoy relatively high trust ratings, around 95%, because people can see and feel their services. But national institutions lag far behind: Congress at 82% and Malacañang at 81%.

In a recent 2025 Pulse Asia poll, only 49% of Filipinos said they trust the Senate, while 40% were undecided. Even the Office of the President's trust rating has slipped in the wake of corruption scandals and controversial spending.

Worse, nine out of ten Filipinos believe public officials are involved in corruption in flood-control projects. When floodwaters rise, it's not just the people's homes that sink but also their faith in government. This is not merely about stolen

money. It's about stolen dignity, stolen futures, stolen trust.

Every delayed permit, every rigged bidding, every empty campaign promise from a smiling politician erodes what little confidence people have left.

Trust is never built by ayuda, press releases or ribbon cuttings. It is built when leaders deliver on their word, treat people fairly, and serve without self-interest.

We don't need geniuses in office. We just need leaders who keep their word and use public funds responsibly.

When government stops working for ordinary citizens, democracy stops working

altogether.

When people lose faith in the system, they fall silent not because they don't care; but because they've stopped expecting anything better. That silence is dangerous.

It breeds apathy instead of accountability. It normalizes lies, excuses, and corruption.

If we don't fix this culture of distrust, we risk becoming a nation that still votes but no longer

The Constitution is clear: Public office is a public trust.

But trust is never automatic; it is earned.

Right now, that trust is bleeding out, slowly, painfully, through a thousand small wounds.

It's time to stop the bleeding.



### ORDINANCE NO. 751, S-2025 (PO-468-07-25)

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING LESSORS TO SUBMIT LESSEE INFORMATION TO THE BARANGAY AND OBTAIN FROM LESES A BARANGAY OCCUPANCY CLEARANCE PRIOR TO ANY OCCUPATION OF RENTAL PROPERTIES WITHIN ANGELES CITY, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Section 6, Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that, "The liberty of abode and of changing the same within the limits prescribed by law shall not be impaired except upon lawful order of the court. Neither shall the right to travel be impaired except in the interest of national security, public safety, or public health, as may be provided by law";

WHEREAS, Section 16, Republic Act ("R.A.") No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 ("LGC"), provides that, "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall xxx maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants";

WHEREAS, there is a growing concern over the increasing number of criminal activities such as illegal drug operations, cybersex crimes, prostitution, and robbery syndicates being discreetly conducted in unlisted or unregistered lodging properties;

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the City Government of Angeles to strengthen the partnership between communities and law enforcement by enforcing regulations that promote accountability and preventive monitoring of rental properties;

WHEREAS, in lieu of the aforementioned matters, the City of Angeles herein takes measures to implement the registration and maintenance of registry in furtherance to the implementation of stricter measures to reduce if not eradicate crimes and drug-related cases prevalent in the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ORDAINED by the 20th Sangguniang Panlungsod of Angeles City, in Session duly assembled that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Tenant Registration Ordinance of Angeles City".

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS. For purposes of this Ordinance, these terms are defined as follows:

- a.Barangay Occupancy Clearance a clearance issued by the Barangay prior to occupancy of the lessee which shall serve as proof that the lessee/tenant has personally appeared before the Barangay.
- b.Consent refers to any freely given, specific, informed indication of will, whereby the tenant agrees to the collection and processing of personal information about and/or relating to him or her.
- c.Lessor/landlord— a lessor, for purposes of this ordinance, refers to a natural person engaged in the business of leasing or letting property to another, whether or not with a necessary permit or license.
- d.Lessee/tenant refers to a person who holds a lease, or who shall occupy a property in the respective barangay, within Angeles City, with a lease period of at least three (3) weeks, whether continuous of staggered.
- e.Lease Agreement the agreement entered into between lessor and lessee for the rent of the subject property;
- f.Personal Information Controller ("PIC") refers to a natural person or any other body, who controls the processing of personal data, or instructs another to process data on his/her behalf.
- g.Rental Properties refers, but is not limited to, apartments, boarding houses, transient rooms, condotels, rental residences, bedspacers.
- SECTION 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is the policy of the City Government of Angeles to prevent the use of rental properties as venues for criminal activities and to promote peace, order, and public safety in all barangays.
- SECTION 4. COVERAGE. This Ordinance shall cover all lessors and lessees who shall enter into lease agreements with a minimum of three (3) week rentals for the subject properties.

This ordinance shall further cover all residential rental properties including but not limited to apartments, boarding houses, bed spaces, transient homes, dormitories, condotels, and any structure or portion of a building leased or rented for residential purposes.

SECTION 5. OBLIGATIONS OF LESSORS. The Lessors shall have the following duties and obligations in the collection and submission of data:

- a. The Lessor shall register the property that is subject for lease for compliance of this ordinance;
- b.The Lessor shall submit to the PIC in the Barangay, a copy of the Lease Agreement along with the Data Privacy Consent Form and a copy of the Barangay Occupancy Clearance/Police Clearance acquired by the Lessee, attached therewith;
- c.The Lessor shall update the PIC in the Barangay for any updates, amendments, revisions, or extensions, on the lease agreements entered into;
- d. The Lessor shall duly inform the respective barangay should the lease agreement be terminated; and
- e.The Lessor is obliged to inform the barangay the information of the lessee those lease agreements falling three (3) weeks below.

SECTION 5-A. The documentary requirements that the Lessor shall submit to the Barangay prior to the commencement of a lease agreement are as follows:

- a. Original Lease Agreement between Lessor and the Lessee;
- b.Photocopy of one (1) valid government-issued identification card bearing the lessee and each accompanying occupants' full name, picture, and signature;
- c. Photocopy of the Data Privacy Consent Form; and
- d.Photocopy of the Barangay Occupancy Clearance or a Police Clearance from the previous barangay resided from.

SECTION 5-B. DATA PRIVACY AND CONFIDENTIALITY. In compliance with R.A. No. 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012, the Data Privacy Form shall have the following provisions, to wit:

- a."I understand that the information I am providing will be used for community safety purposes and will be protected in accordance with the Data Privacy Act. I consent to the processing of my personal data as outlined."; and
- b. "The collection and handling of all tenant information shall strictly comply with the Data Privacy Act of 2012. Tenants shall be informed of their rights and how their information will be used and protected."

All personal data collected under this ordinance shall be:

- 1. Collected lawfully, fairly, and for legitimate purposes related to public safety and community welfare;
- 2.Stored securely in the official records of the Barangay and used only for law enforcement coordination and crime prevention:
- 3.Accessed only by authorized barangay personnel and law enforcement agents, when necessary;
- 4. Protected in accordance with Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise known as the Data Privacy Act of 2012;
- 5. Retained only as long as necessary for its intended purpose and securely disposed of thereafter.

SECTION 6. OBLIGATIONS OF THE LESSEE. The Lessee shall have the obligation to personally register with the respective barangay to secure a Barangay Occupancy Clearance and furnish a copy thereof to the Lessor within seven (7) days from the start of the lease agreement or move-in.

The Lessee shall also furnish a barangay clearance from the previous residence or a police clearance and furnish the Lessor a copy thereof.

SECTION 7. IMPLEMENTING AUTHORITY. In compliance with the Department of Interior and Local Government ("DILG") Memorandum Circular (M.C.) No. 2024-135, and the Local Government Unit Support System ("LGUSS") – Barangay Information Management System ("BIMS"), the Barangay shall have the following obligations:

- a. The Barangay Chairperson shall designate or appoint a Personal Information Controller ("PIC") who is responsible for processing and keeping the information collected. The PIC can be the Barangay Secretary.
- b. The Barangay PIC shall maintain a database or repository of data of all rental properties within the Barangay Hall.
- c.The Barangay PIC shall maintain a database or repository, and upload the necessary tenant information to the DILG's LGUSS-BIMS website.
- d. The Barangay Council shall coordinate with law enforcement for time-to-time on-site verification that the subject property is listed as for lease.

e.The Barangay PIC shall retain information only as long as necessary as determined by the PIC for the fulfillment of the purposes for which they were obtained or for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims, or for legitimate business purposes, or as provided by law.

f.The Barangay PIC shall observe utmost confidentiality and data integrity in consonance with the Data Privacy Act and other applicable laws and regulations.

SECTION 8. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENTS. Expenses to be incurred for the implementation of this Ordinance, shall be charged against the General Funds of the respective Barangay, subject to existing budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules and procedures.

SECTION 9. PENALTIES. The following penalties shall be imposed for any act or omission violating this Ordinance, without prejudice to other existing and applicable laws, rules, and regulations:

- a. Lessor or Lessee
- 1) First Offense: Fine of One Thousand Pesos (₱1,000);
- 2) Second Offense: Fine of Three Thousand Pesos (₱3,000);
- 3)Third/Succeeding Offenses: Fine of Five Thousand Pesos (₱5,000).

b.In case of data breach occurring due to negligence, the PICs or its responsible officials are subject to the penalties specified in Sections 25-37, Chapter VII of the Data Privacy Act of 2012.

SECTION 10. PUBLICATION. This Ordinance shall be posted at prominent places in every barangay in three (3) consecutive weeks, published in a newspaper of general circulation within the territorial jurisdiction of Angeles City, the Angeles City Information Office shall publish the gist of this Ordinance in all available social media platforms, as necessary.

SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 12. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, rules and regulations, or part thereof, where provisions are in conflict or contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

If computed, Vicenta and Ildefonso are already 123 and 124 years old, respectively. Also, all their children, namely: Aurora, Ligaya, Pablo, Ruben, Ildefonso, Jose and Generoso, are all dead. Thus, the Honorable Court may take judicial notice of the death of Vicenta and

- 11. The aforesaid Transfer Certificate of Title No. 70337-R was issued on the 20th day of August 1969 and was derived from Original Transfer Certificate of Title No. 7653 which was issued pursuant to Decree No. 115738, L.R.C. Cad. Record No. 148 registered on 28th
- 12. The plaintiffs' ancestors have been in actual and physical possession of the subject property since time immemorial until their passing. This possession has been continuously maintained by the plaintiffs, as they have never been deprived of it up to the present
- 13. Sometime in June 2014, the plaintiffs-heirs of the registered owners of the property held a meeting to partition the said property among the existing heirs. Plaintiff Pedrito Luzung was tasked by the family to look after the documentation of the partition on the lots. He referred the matter to a Geodetic Engineer to prepare the plan of
- 14. Thereafter, plaintiff Pedrito L. Luzung was informed by his Geodetic Engineer that the plan of partition cannot be made because the Bureau of Lands approved plans of partition pertaining to patent
- 15. Immediately, Engr. Luzung went to the CENRO Pampanga to verify the findings of the Geodetic Engineer and there, he found out that several patents were already issued to Spouses Efrain Juan L. Soto, Jr. and Zelinda Barrios Soto, and herein defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes on the same land covered by TCT No. 70337-R.
- 16. To check on these patent titles, Engr. Luzung went to the Assessor's Office of Bacolor, Pampanga where he discovered that several tax declarations have been issued to Efrain Juan Soto and herein defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes on the same land based on the patent titles
- 17. Along with the patent titles issued by CENRO Pampanga to Spouses Soto, the following patent titles were issued to herein defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes, with their respective assessed value as per their tax declarations, are as follows:

18. Also discovered by the plaintiffs are the existence of approved plans covering the subject land, all issued without the consent of the plaintiffs or their ascendants. As it appears on records, the approved plan that contains Cadastral Lot 323 of Bacolor, Pampanga as described on TCT No. 70337-R of the plaintiffs was cancelled by the Bureau of Lands without the consent and conformity of the plaintiffs. As a result, subdivision plan Csd-03-017129 was approved on September 13, 2006 resulting into the subdivision of Lot 323 into Lots 323-A to 323-D.36

- 19. On November 3, 2006, the Bureau of Lands again approved another subdivision plan without the consent of the plaintiffs, this time covering Lot 323-D, subdividing the same and changing it to Lot Nos. 4004-A to 4004-L as per subdivision plan, Csd-03-017312.33
- 20. During their lifetime, some of the predecessors 20. During their literline, some or the predecessors-in-interest of the plaintiffs through herein plaintiff Pedrito L. Luzung filed a case against Sps. Efrain Juan L. Soto and Zelinda Barrios Soto and defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes. The nature of the said case is similar to this case except that it also prayed for Declaration of Unenforceability of Mortgage (involving Spouses Sotos titles) and all Proceedings had thereon. It was docketed as Civil Case No. 14264, originally raffled at Regional Trial Court Branch 42 City of San Fernando. Pampanga and was thereafter re-raffled to Branch 44 of Fernando, Pampanga, and was thereafter re-raffled to Branch 44 of the same jurisdiction. However, the case against defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes was dismissed without prejudice,<sup>38</sup> hence this re-filing. Thereafter, the Presiding Judge of RTC Branch 44 inhibited herself

from the proceedings, thus leading to the re-raffle of the Civil Case No. 14264 to RTC Branch 48, City of San Fernando, Pampanga. The said case as against Sps. Efrain Juan L. Soto and Zelinda Barrios Soto, Unity Bank, its assignee China Bank Savings Inc. and all the other ndants in this case is now pending in RTC Branch 48.

### III. FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION - QUIETING OF TITLE

21. The remedy of quieting of title is governed by Article 476 and 477 of the Civil Code, which state:

or any interest therein, by reason of any instrument, record claim, encumbrance or proceeding which is apparently valid or effective but is in truth and in fact invalid, ineffective, voidable, or unenforceable, and may be prejudicial to said title, an action may be brought to remove such cloud or to quiet the title.

An action may also be brought to prevent a cloud from being cast upon title to real property or any interest

"Art, 477. The plaintiff must have legal or equitable title to, or interest in the real property which is the subject-matter of the action. He need not be in possession of said

- 22. As held by the Honorable Supreme Court in the case of Sps. Ernesto Yu and Elsie Yu vs. Elogio A. Topacio Jr.<sup>39</sup>, in order that an action for quieting of title may prosper, two requisites must concur: (1) the plaintiff or complainant has a legal or equitable title or interest in the real property subject of the action; and (2) the deed, claim, encumbrance, or proceeding claimed to be casting cloud on his title must be shown to be in fact invalid or inoperative despite its prima facie appearance of validity or legal efficacy.
- 23. The first requisite is based on Article 477 of the Civil Code which requires that the plaintiff must have legal or equitable title to, or interest in the real property which is the subject matter of the action. It is beyond dispute that Lot 323 (covered by TCT No. 70337-R) subject of the instant case is among the list of real or immovable property enumerated under Article 415 of the Civil Code<sup>40</sup>.

- 24. Legal title denotes registered ownership, while equitable title means beneficial ownership, <sup>41</sup> meaning a title derived through a valid contract or relation and based on recognized equitable principles.<sup>42</sup>
- 25. In the instant case, the plaintiffs have a valid cause of action against the defendants herein for Quieting of Title on the following reasons:
  - Plaintiffs are the successors-in-interest and compulsory heirs of the deceased registered owners Vicenta Galang Vda. De Labung, Domingo Labung, and Ignacia Licup thus they have all the legal right, title, claim or interest over the subject real property.
  - ii. The patent titles issued to Spouses Efrain Juan L. Soto, Jr. and Zelinda Barrios Soto and herein defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes as well as all their corresponding tax declarations, subdivision plans, and lot data computation sheets, are documents, records or claims which appear to be valid on their faces although the truth is, they emanated from fraudulent means. These patent titles, tax declarations, subdivision plans and lot data computation sheets per se, cast a cloud to plaintiffs' claim, title, interest or ownership over the subject Lot 323 because looking on the said documents or records, they would seem to connote ownership by Spouses Efrain Juan Soto Jr. and Zelinda Barrios Soto herein defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbez of the portions of Lot 323.
- 26. This claim of ownership and existence of patent titles and tax declarations under the name of Spouses Efrain Juan Soto Jr. and Zelinda Barrios Soto and defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes <u>involving the same Lot 323</u> necessarily creates a cloud in the title of the plaintiffs over the subject property which is sought to be removed through the institution of the instant action.
  - IV. SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION CANCELLATION OF PATENT TITLES, SUBDIVISION PLANS, LOT DATA COMPUTATION SHEETS, AND TAX DECLARATIONS
- 27. As previously stated, on the basis of the aforesaid plans which were illegally approved and unauthorized, the patent titles in the

names of Sps. Soto and herein defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes were issued.

- 28. The issuance of the said subdivision plans and patent titles are clearly VOID from the beginning. The approval of the plans does not bear the consent of the plaintiffs or their predecessors-in-interest. The issuance of the patent titles is also VOID considering that the subject lot has already been issued a decree of registration by the Court of First Instance of Pampanga acting as Cadastral Court in L.R.C. Cad. Record No. 148. As per plaintiffs' title, Decree No. 115738 was issued and properly registered on the 28th day of November 1921 in the Register of Deeds of Pampanga. Pursuant to this Decree No. 115738, Original Certificate of Title No. 7653 was issued. The present title of the plaintiffs' predecessors-in-interest, TCT No. 7037-R issued on August 20, 1969, was derived from this OCT No. 7653. It is still valid and existing in the Register of Deeds of Pampanga.<sup>43</sup>
- 29. Once a lot is issued a decree, it can no longer be applied for a patent, much more be issued a patent title. To do so would result in duplication of the titles covering the same property with different conflicting owners. The resulting titles are clearly VOID being inimical to the evils being prevented by the Torrens System of Land Registration. Clearly, the defendant Garbes's approved subdivision plans, lot data computation sheets and patent titles are VOID and produce no legal effect as against the title of herein plaintiffs' predecessors-in-interest.
- 30. Hence, under Sections 31 and 32 of Presidential Decree No. 1529, the decree on the land is incontrovertible and indefeasible, thus:

Section 31. Decree of registration. Every decree of registration issued by the Commissioner shall bear the date, hour and minute of its entry, and shall be signed by him. It shall state whether the owner is married or unmarried, and if married, the name of the husband or wife: Provided, however, that if the land adjudicated by the court is conjugal property, the decree shall be issued in the name of both spouses. If the owner is under disability, it shall state the nature of disability, and if a minor, his age. It shall contain a description of the land as finally determined by the court, and shall set forth the estate of the owner, and also, in such manner as to show their relative priorities, all particular estates, mortgages, easements, liens, attachments, and other encumbrances, including rights of tenant-farmers, if

any, to which the land or owner's estate is subject, as well as any other matters properly to be determined in pursuance of this Decree.

The decree of registration shall bind the land and quiet title thereto, subject only to such exceptions or liens as may be provided by law. It shall be conclusive upon and against all persons, including the National Government and all branches thereof, whether mentioned by name in the application or notice, the same being included in the general description "To all whom it may concern".

Section 32. Review of decree of registration; Innocent purchaser for value. The decree of registration shall not be reopened or revised by reason of absence, minority, or other disability of any person adversely affected thereby, nor by any person adversely affected thereby, nor by any proceeding in any count for reversing judgments, subject, however, to the right of any person, including the government and the branches thereof, deprived of land or of any estate or interest therein by such adjudication or confirmation of title obtained by actual fraud, to file in the proper Court of First Instance a petition for reopening and review of the decree of registration not later than one year from and after the date of the entry of such decree of registration, but in on case shall such petition be entertained by the court where an innocent purchaser for value has acquired the land or an interest therein, whose rights may be prejudiced. Whenever the phrase "innocent purchaser for value" or an equivalent phrase occurs in this Decree, it shall be deemed to include an innocent lessee, mortgagee, or other encumbrancer for value.

Upon the expiration of said period of one year, the decree of registration and the certificates of title issued shall become incontrovertible. Any person aggrieved by such decree of registration in any case may pursue his remedy by action for damages against the applicant or any other persons responsible for the fraud. (emphasis, supplied).

31. Likewise, by the very provision of Commonwealth Act No. 141 on application for and approval of patent titles, it is clear that no patent title shall be issued to lands already owned by private persons, Section 8. Only those lands shall be declared open to disposition or concession which have been officially delimited and classified and, when practicable, surveyed, and which have not been reserved for public or quasi-public uses, nor appropriated by the Government, nor in any manner become private property, nor those on which a private right authorized and recognized by this Act or any other valid law may be claimed, or which, having been reserved or appropriated, have ceased to be so However, the President may, for reasons of public interest, declare lands of the public domain open to disposition before the same have had their boundaries established or been surveyed, or may, for the same reason, suspend their concession or disposition until they are again declared open to concession or disposition by proclamation duly published or by Act of the National Assembly. (Emphasis, supplied).

### V. THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION – DAMAGES AND ATTORNEY'S FEES

- 32. By reason of the unlawful subdivisions of Lot 323, the illegal application for issuance of patent titles and approval and issuance of patent titles made in favor of defendant Cherryl Tuazon Garbes by the Bureau of Land-Region III and the CENRO-Pampanga, the plaintiffs were compelled to engage the services of counsel to litigate this case, where they agreed to pay attorney's fees in the amount of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P100,000.00) and appearance fee of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) per court appearance. In addition, defendants shall be compelled to pay the filing fee of this Complaint and all other related expenses, the amount of which shall be proven during the trial of this case.
- 33. All the foregoing fees and expenses must be awarded to the plaintiffs and must be paid, jointly and solidarily by the Bureau of Lands-Region III and CENRO-PAMPANGA for having acted in bad faith or in gross neglect of their sworn duties and responsibilities and by Cherryl Tuazon Garbes who have acted in bad faith.

### VI. JURISDICTION

34. Civil Case No.14264 was filed before the Regional Trial Court in pursuance with the case of *Sabitsana vs. Muertegui*<sup>44</sup>, where the Honorable Supreme Court categorically stated that:

"On the question of jurisdiction, it is clear under the Rules that an action for quieting of title may be instituted in the RTCs, regardless of the assessed value of the real property in dispute. Under Rule 63 of the Rules of Court, an action to quiet title to real property or remove clouds therefrom may be brought in the appropriate RTC.

It must be remembered that the suit for quieting of title was prompted by petitioners' August 24, 1998 letter-opposition to respondent's application for registration. Thus, in order to prevent a cloud from being cast upon his application for a title, respondent filed Civil Case No. B-1097 to obtain a declaration of his rights. In this sense, the action is one for declaratory relief, which properly falls within the jurisdiction of the RTC pursuant to Rule 63 of the Rules."

35. The instant case however, is being filed in pursuance with the <u>prevailing and latest</u> Decision of the Honorable Supreme Court in the case of *Guillermo Salvador et. al vs. Patricia, Inc.*<sup>45</sup>, where it held that:

"But the same was not true in the case of the cause of action for the quieting of title, which had the nature of a real action—that is, an action that involves the issue of ownership or possession of real property, or any interest in real property." in view of the expansion of the jurisdiction of the first level courts under Republic Act No. 7691, which amended Section 33(3) of Batas Pambansa Blg. 129 effective on April 15, 1994, to now pertinently provide as follows:

Section 33. Jurisdiction of Metropolitan Trial Courts, Municipal Trial Courts and Municipal Circuit Trial Courts in Civil Cases. - Metropolitan Trial Courts, Municipal Trial Courts and Municipal Circuit Trial Courts shall exercise:

(3) Exclusive original jurisdiction in all civil actions which involve title to, possession of, real property, or any interest therein where the assessed value of the property or interest therein does not exceed Twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00) or, in civil actions in Metro Manila, where such assessed value does not exceeds (sic) Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000.00) exclusive of interest, damages of whatever kind, attorneys fees, litigation expenses and costs: x x x

As such, the determination of which trial court had the exclusive original jurisdiction over the real action is dependent on the assessed value of the property in dispute.

XXX

An action to quiet title is to be brought as a special civil action under Rule 63 of the *Rules of Court*. Although Section 1 of Rule 63 specifies the forum to be "the appropriate Regional Trial Court," the specification does not override the statutory provision on jurisdiction. xxx

It is important to note that Section 1, Rule 63 of the Rules of Court does not categorically require that an action to quiet title be filed before the RTC. It repeatedly uses the word "may" that an action for quieting of title "may be brought under [the] Rule" on petitions for declaratory relief, and a person desiring to file a petition for declaratory relief "may x x x bring an action in the appropriate Regional Trial Court." The use of the word "may" in a statute denotes that the provision is merely permissive and indicates a mere possibility, an opportunity or an option.

In contrast, the mandatory provision of the Judiciary Reorganization Act of 1980, as amended, uses the word shall and explicitly requires the MTC to exercise exclusive original Jurisdiction over all civil actions which involve title to or possession of real property where the assessed value does not exceed P20,000.00, thus:

XXX

(Underscoring and emphasis supplied)

36. Also, in the case of *Montero vs. Montero*<sup>46</sup>, the Honorable Supreme Court said that:

"According to jurisprudence," [i]n a number of cases, [the Court has] held that actions for reconveyance of or for cancellation of title to or to quiet title over real property are actions that fall under the classification of cases that involve [little to, or possession of, real property, or any interest therein."

37. In this connection, Section 2 of REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11576, July 30, 2021, otherwise known as AN ACT FURTHER EXPANDING THE JURISDICTION OF THE METROPOLITAN TRIAL COURTS, MUNICIPAL TRIAL COURTS IN CITIES, MUNICIPAL TRIAL COURTS, AND MUNICIPAL CIRCUIT TRIAL COURTS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE BATAS PAMBANSA BLG. 129, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE JUDICIARY REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1980," AS AMENDED, states:

Section 2. Section 33 of the same law is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 33. Jurisdiction of the Metropolitan Trial Courts, Municipal Trial Courts in Cities, Municipal Trial Courts, and Municipal Circuit Trial Courts in Civil Cases. – Metropolitan Trial Courts, Municipal Trial Courts in Cities, Municipal Trial Courts, and Municipal Circuit Trial Courts shall exercise:

"(3) Exclusive original jurisdiction in all civil actions which involve title to, or possession of, real property, or any interest therein where the assessed value of the property or any interest therein does not exceed Four hundred thousand pesos (P400,000.00) exclusive on interest, damages of whatever kind, attorney's fees, litigation expenses and costs: *Provided*, That in cases of land not declared for taxation purposes, the value of such property shall be determined by the assessed value of the adjacent lots."

38. The assessed value of the subject property based on Tax Declaration No. GR2020-03-0019-03377 is P9,890.00. While in the two <a href="questioned">questioned</a> Tax Declaration No. A-04019-1879-A and Tax Declaration No. A-04019-1880-A have assessed values of P570.00 and P580.00, respectively. Hence, the instant Complaint involving title to and possession of the said property is within the exclusive original jurisdiction of this Honorable Court.

### VII. DOCUMENTARY & TESTIMONIAL EVIDENCE

- 39. Plaintiffs shall present Engr. Pedrito Luzung, who will testify on his personality to file the instant case, the current status of the property, the registered owners, the compulsory heirs of the registered owners, and how Lot 323 was illegally subdivided into several lots and portions thereof were illegally patented in favor of defendant Cherryl Garbes. His Judicial Affidavit is attached as ANNEX "A".
- 40. A representative of Register of Deeds will likewise be presented to identify TCT No. 70337-R and all documents relative thereto. His testimony will prove that TCT No. 70337-R was issued pursuant to Decree No. 115738, L.R.C. Cad. Record No. 148 registered on the 28th day of November 1921. The said witness will also prove that TCT No. 70337-R is still under the names of Vicenta Galang Vda. de Labung (1/3 share); Domingo Galang, widower (1/3 share); Ignacia Licup, widow (1/6 share) and Isidoro Ayuyao. The Affidavit of the representative from the Registry of Deeds for the Province of Pampanga shall be submitted in the course of the trial considering that there is a need for issuance of subpoena to the said office prior to the preparation of his/her Judicial Affidavit.

Starting October 26, CEB will operate direct flights between Clark and Naga four times weekly every Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday. Meanwhile, three times weekly flights between Clark and San Jose will begin on October 28 and operate every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

a community hospital funded by the Department of Health.

Initially a BUCAS (Bagong Urgent Care and Ambulatory Service) Center, the facility shall provide fast, accessible, and affordable immediate outpatient medical care to residents, especially the poor, serving as an intermediate step between primary health clinics and large hospitals.

Expanded health services with special focus on indigents that the mayor initiated include free wheelchairs, walkers, and vials of insulin. Soon to rise too is the municipal animal bite center and the Consulta Center within the municipal compound that will further enhance access to free and quality health care.

Labung's can-do intensity impacted too in the town's long-time problems of garbage and traffic.

The mayor not only

cleaned the Augean stable that was the materials recovery facility but regimented the collection of garbage, procured a brandnew garbage truck from the provincial government, and doubled the wages of garbage collectors in recognition of their valuable service to the community.

Clearing the streets of obstructions, no-nonsense enforcement of no-parking laws on major throughfares, opening side streets, the deployment of more traffic enforcers with corresponding pay increases dramatically accelerated traffic flow in the municipality.

Line and pavement markings, including pedestrian lanes as well as the asphalting of the Jose Abad Santos Avenue from the Arayat-Sta. Ana boundary to the town proper also helped in the highly improved traffic flow.

Living up to his advocacy

of government transparency. Labung strictly implemented a policy of "No SOP," referencing the total absence of "Suhol o Padulas" in the local government where he fostered a culture of integrity, honesty, and dignity.

To ensure efficiency and accountability, the local government created an internal audit unit and holds weekly meetings with department heads. The mayor also removed the Mayor's Working Permit fee, which was a welcome relief to local workers and small business owners.

Servant leadership, Labung made most manifest in donating his entire salary alternately to students, solo parents, disabled persons, others in the marginalized sector, and even the parish pastoral council.

This, even as the LGU has institutionalized social and livelihood projects like the "Angat Pamilya, Labung Sta. Ana," which empowers poor families through training and support. Relief distribution, educational subsidy, and programs for senior citizens and those on the peripheries of local society remain constant and consistent.

"Education is a great force for change." With that as a core value, the mayor firmly holds that investing in the students is investing in the future of Sta. Ana.

Since Labung's assumption of the mayorship, LGU support to learners has doubled down through educational assistance and scholarship grants and subsidies for poor but deserving students.

In his aggressive effort to increase the availability of higher education in town, he also allocated a portion of the lot that he donated for the proposed Pampanga State University-Sta. Ana Campus, with plans and negotiations already on the pipeline. The local government also has an active role to help schools upgrade facilities and equipment so that they are able to produce a more productive learning environment.

Cognizant of Sta. Ana as still largely agricultural, the municipal government regularly provides cash subsidy, hybrid and inbred seeds, fertilizers, and other farm inputs to help farmers bounce back from calamities and improve crop production. Anti-rabies vaccination campaign sessions are also ongoing as part of the animal health program of the LGU.

Not simple promotion and preservation but the enrichment of culture and heritage in Sta. Ana, has the Labung mayoralty embarked upon.

At the 2025 Sta. Ana Town Fiesta the LGU hosted commenced the Most Outstanding Pimpeño Awards as recognition to the town's citizens whose achievements

in their fields of endeavor gave pride and prestige to Sta. Ana. The very name of the award honors and rediscovers the legacy of the town once named "Pinpin."

Currently, the LGU is in the thick of negotiations with the Tourism Infrastructure and Enterprise Zone Authority to build a tourist rest area where local products and attractions would be showcased.

Milestones in health care. environmental management, traffic alleviation, education, social services and transparency in governance in the first 100 days are no mean feat for just any other local government executive.

Dinan Labung though is not just any other. With his governance solidly grounded on "Mabilis ang Aksyon, Walang Korapsyon," there is no other way for Sta. Ana but to soar to progress with integrity, efficiency, and high public trust.

interoperability between our electronic toll collection (ETC) systems, Autosweep and Easytrip. This latest feature will directly benefit motorists who will register for a new ETC account, as they will only need one radio frequency identification (RFID) and account to travel seamlessly across the Luzon expressway network," both companies said in a joint statement.

The One RFID program covers all toll roads in Luzon such as Tarlac-Pangasinan-La Union Expressway (TPLEX), Subic-Clark-Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX), North Luzon Expressway (NLEX), NLEX Connector, Skyway System, NAIA Expressway, Manila-Cavite Expressway (Cavitex), Cavitex-C5 Link, Muntinlupa-Cavite Expressway (MCX), Cavite-Laguna Expressway (CALAX), South Luzon Expressway (SLEX), and the STAR Tollway.
