SM Cares delivers over 70-K books nationwide



Capampangan, A to Z

THIS THURSDAY, December 11, marks the 454th year of the founding of the Province of Pampanga, the first in the entire island of Luzon by the Spanish conquistadores. Enough cause not only for a grand celebration but also of that conceit the Capampangan is widely known for.

Unwanting to reprint for the nth time my paean to the Aldo ning Capampangan that originally appeared in another publication in 1998, I engaged in some quick top-of-mind randomness on everything Capampangan with the letters of the alphabet as only guide for some semblance

Arayat, naturally comes first. The Bunduc *Alaya* of old that lords over the plains of Central Luzon impacts the majesty, if not the primacy, of the province over the rest of the region. Abe, dear friend, doubled to oneness in abe-abe, so central in the vocabulary as in our character as a distinct race, as we have long elevated ourselves to be. **Augustinians**, the harbingers of the Faith enshrined as much in the hearts and souls of the native Capampangans as in their magnificent churches.

Traitor to his landowning class, he fathered socialism in the Philippines, and – to me – equals in greatness the martyrdom of his brother, Chief Justice Jose Abad Santos.

Ebun, principal agro-product that formed one half of Candaba town's iconic festival, cause of the province's economic woes with the bird flu scare in August-October. *Everybody's Café*, unarguably serving the best in home-cooked Capampangan dishes, major contributor to Pampanga being hailed the Culinary Capital of the Philippines.

Furniture and furnishings, from the antique to the "antiqued" that gave the world "Betis Baroque" to exotic rattan, metal and cast-iron, all crafted exquisitely by the country's best artisans.

GMA. Love her. Hate her. But there's no denying the economic fundamentals instituted during her watch did the nation good. And she still wins elections, even during her incarceration, er, hospital arrest, with or without her neck brace.

Hot air balloon. Once the only thing Clark was good at. Now, much better off in Lubao. Go, ask the balloonists themselves. H - in the Capampangan tongue – silent where present. stressed where absent. As in hay ev ha aws hin

llustrado, the social class to which every Capampangan assumes himself/herself as belonging to, no matter his/her socio-economic condition. With outward manifestation in his/her being

holds but a dime.

Kamaru, mole cricket, invariably cooked deepfried adobo. Reputedly an aphrodisiac for the Capampangan macho.

Leguan - a living, walking celebration of beauty is the Capampangan woman, as the local ditty puts it aptly, aro catimias na nitang dalaga...

Mequeni – a most welcoming invitation as much to the home as to the heart of the Capampangan. Nanay. Motherhood becoming the best practice

of provincial governance. O't. What other dialect, or language for that matter, possesses a word comprising two letters conjoined by an apostrophe? O't macanyan ca? O't balamu matudtud ya mu ing meiangu bie.

Parul, the Christmas lantern that is both shibboleth of our faith as Catholics and our culture and craftsmanship as Capampangan taken to gigantic proportions with the City of San Fernando's signature festival. *Pinatubo*, from which devastating eruption triumphed, excelled, soared the Capampangan spirit to greater heights of development and glory.

Qng, queca, queni, quibal, calaquian, tuquil... the Q in Capampangan words losing to the Tagalog's K. What gives? Neither seen nor even heard for the longest time now that feardefying riposte "Queng leon, queng tigri e cu tatacut. Queca pa?'

Wetlands, particularly the Candaba Swamp, where the annual migration of birds from temperate countries has put the province in the world wildlife

The shame we must finally face: PHL is the world's #1 source of ocean trash

THIS IMAGE is painful to look at. The Philippines—our beloved archipelago of 7,641 islands—is ranked Number 1 in the world in contributing trash to the ocean. Not number one in reading, science, or mathematics. Not number one in good governance or environmental stewardship. But number one in polluting the very seas that give us life.

How did we get here?

More than twenty years ago, we passed one of the most progressive laws in Asia: RA 9003, the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act. I remember reading it and being struck by its moral clarity. The law abolished open dumpsites. It required every LGU to dispose of solid waste legally only through sanitary landfills—but sanitary landfills are meant to receive only residual waste. That is possible only if segregation from source actually happens.


Because that is the heart of RA 9003:

Segregation, Composting, Recycling → Residual Waste (the least possible amount).

But what have we done instead?

We continue a national habit of throwing everything together—biodegradable, recyclable, hazardous, medical, industrial—into the same black bag, the same truck, the same dumpsite. So our landfills are filled to the brim not because our waste is too much, but because we refuse to obey the most basic rule: segregate your trash. Sanitary landfills, without segregation, become nothing more than unsanitary landfills.

A rare gift or grit

If the fight against public works corruption is a race against time, President Bongbong Marcos gives the unmistakable impression that his government will be up to speed to end it, probably once and for all. You may add, friends, foes and family, political or otherwise, will not be spared to do that, to

The public says, so be it, or amen, even alleluia if he can achieve a difficult objective, meaning politics is such a rarefied field the commitment could also mean political hara kiri.

PBBM's firm timeline is Christmas, considered the longest festivity in this neck of the woods, conceivably a longer political calendar. The wrong doers will spend Christmas behind bars. He means business short of naming who will be the first victims of his determined action against corrupt leaders or business people in government.

The public is waiting eagerly for PBBM to make good his promise. There are already candidates known to the public. It's just a matter of time or formality.

Winning is also tipping the balance on the political calculus that may have triggered a colossal collapse in the nation's moral equilibrium. It also could mean decisively upending a geopolitical threat where some leaders maybe a part of a conspiracy. There are other collateral issues,

Back then, the Noche Buena table wasn't assembled through delivery apps. There was no rider



AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL BARANGAYS WITHIN MABALACAT CITY TO SECURE THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS, PERMITS, AND CLEARANCES PRIOR TO THE CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, OR IMPLEMENTATION OF ANY INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE THEREOF

SPONSORED BY: HON. NOELITO B. CASTRO

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that every local government unit shall exercise powers essential to the promotion of the general welfare, including the preservation of comfort, convenience, peace, and safety of its constituents;

WHEREAS, Section 444 (b)(1)(vi) of the same Code mandates the Punong Barangay to enforce all laws and ordinances pertaining to barangay governance, including those related to the use of its properties, facilities, and resources;

WHEREAS, barangay-initiated infrastructure projects are vital to community development, but such projects must be planned, constructed, and maintained in accordance with national and local standards to ensure safety, sustainability, and compliance with city development plans;

WHEREAS, requiring barangays to secure the appropriate permits, clearances, and certifications prior to the commencement of any construction, renovation, or infrastructure-related activity ensures that projects are structurally sound, environmentally compliant, and aligned with zoning, sanitation, and disaster-risk

WHEREAS, the City Government of Mabalacat recognizes the importance of instituting a uniform system of documentation and compliance to avoid duplication, wastage of funds, hazards, and other potential liabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Ignacio Miguel M. Morales II, duly seconded by Hons. Ong, Soliven& Acorda, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Mabalacat in session assembled, that:

This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the "Barangay Project Documentation

and Compliance Ordinance of Mabalacat City."

SECTION 2. Scope and Coverage

This Ordinance shall cover all barangays within the territorial jurisdiction of Mabalacat City undertaking any of the following infrastructure-related undertakings regardless of funding source:

a) Construction or renovation of barangay-owned or managed facilities such as barangay halls, health centers, day care centers, multi-purpose halls, covered courts, and similar public buildings;

b) Community infrastructure including roads, bridges, footpaths, drainage systems, waiting sheds, fences, streetlights, and similar structures;

> c) Any projects funded through the Barangay Development Fund (BDF), development assistance (ODA), or private donations;

Other physical improvements intended for public use, benefit, or service.

SECTION 3. Required Documents and Clearances

Before the commencement of any project, the concerned barangay shall secure the

- a) Barangay Resolution Officially approving the project proposal, passed by the Sangguniang Barangay;
- b) Building Permit Issued by the City Engineering or City Building Office;
 c) Zoning and Land Use Clearance Issued by the City Planning and
- Development Office (CPDO);
 d) Environmental Clearance Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) or Certificate of Non-Coverage (CNC) when applicable, from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) or its authorized office;
- e) Barangay Clearance If applicable to the project site location; f) City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (CDRRM) Endorsement Certification from the CDRRM Office ensuring that the project integrates
- disaster resilience and safety standards; g) Other permits and certifications - As may be required by existing national or local laws, rules, or regulations

SECTION 4. Monitoring and Compliance

- a) The Office of the City Engineer, in coordination with the City Planning and Development Office (CPDO), shall serve as the lead office in monitoring compliance with this Ordinance.
- b) The City Engineer shall maintain a Registry of Barangay Projects
- documenting approved permits, clearances, and certifications.

 c) Barangays shall submit quarterly reports to the Sangguniang Panlungsod through the Committee on Public Works and Infrastructure.

- d) Forfeiture of city government assistance or endorsements for subsequent barangay infrastructure projects until compliance is rectified.

SECTION 6. Separability Clause

If any provision or part of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid and enforceable.

SECTION 7. Repealing Clause

All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, rules, and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. Effectivity

This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places in Mabalacat City and its publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the Province of Pampanga.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND PROVIDING FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PUBLIC UTILITY VEHICLE MODERNIZATION PROGRAM (PUVMP) OF THE LAND TRANSPORTATION FRANCHISING AND REGULATORY BOARD (LTFRB) AND THE APPROVED ROUTE RATIONALIZATION PLAN WITHIN THE CITY OF MABALACAT

WHEREAS, the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB), under the Department of Transportation (DOTr), is mandated to regulate and issue franchises for public utility vehicles in accordance with national transportation policy;

WHEREAS, the LTFRB has launched the Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program, (PUVMP), which aims to provide a safe, reliable, convenient, accessible, environmentfriendly, and sustainable public transportation system for all Filipinos;

WHEREAS, the PUVMP includes the Route Rationalization Plan (RRP) that identifies and assigns specific routes for modernized public utility vehicles (PUVs), including modernized jeepneys, to improve efficiency and connectivity across local government units:

WHEREAS, the City of Mabalacat recognizes the need to modernize and rationalize existing public transport routes within its territorial jurisdiction to decongest roads, improve commuter safety, and enhance air quality in alignment with national and local development goals;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers local government units to exercise such powers as are necessary for efficient and effective governance and to promote the general welfare of their constituents;

WHEREAS, the City Government of Mabalacat acknowledges the importance of aligning its local transport system with the LTFRB's modernization framework and rationalized routes for the efficient movement of people and goods;

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Mabalacat City, Pampanga in session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Mabalacat City Public Utility Vehicle Modernization and Route Rationalization Ordinance of 2025."

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY.

It is hereby declared the policy of the City Government of Mabalacat to adopt, support, and implement the Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program (PUVMP) of the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) and the Department of Transportation (DOTr), including the approved Route Rationalization Plan (RRP) for all public utility vehicles operating within the city.

SECTION 3. ADOPTION OF THE LTFRB ROUTE RATIONALIZATION PLAN.

The City Government of Mabalacat hereby formally adopts the LTFRB-approved Route Rationalization Plan (RRP) applicable to the city. All local routes identified therein shall be recognized as the official and authorized public transport routes within Mabalacat City.

SECTION 4. LOCAL COORDINATION AND IMPLEMENTATION.

The City Mayor, through the City Traffic Management Office and the Mabalacat City Traffic Enforcement Group (MCTEG), in coordination with LTFRB Region III, shall:

- 1. Facilitate the dissemination of the approved routes to all existing transport operators and drivers:
- 2. Assist in the organization and consolidation of transport cooperatives or corporations:
- 3. Provide technical, administrative, and logistical support for the smooth transition to modernized public utility vehicles; and,
- 4. Ensure that all local traffic management policies conform with the LTFRBapproved Route Rationalization Plan.

SÉCTION 5. PUBLIC INFORMATION AND EDUCATION CAMPAIGN.

The City Government, through its City Information Office (CIO), shall undertake continuous information, education, and communication activities to ensure that transport operators, drivers, and the commuting public are properly informed of the provisions, benefits, and procedures under the PUV Modernization Program and the Route Rationalization Plan.

SECTION 6. PENALTY CLAUSE.

Any operator, driver, or transport group found violating the rationalized route system or operating without proper coordination, permits, or franchise authority as prescribed by the LTFRB and the City Government shall be subject to administrative and/or legal action in accordance with national laws, LTFRB regulations, and local ordinances.

SECTION 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.

If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions hereof.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and publication in a newspaper of general circulation within Mabalacat City, or by posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places in the city, in accordance with law.

From the time he came to knowledge and up to the present, he has been known with a sex/ gender of a Male and has been using 16 May 1970 as his true and correct date of birth, as evidenced by his Certificate of Marriage2, Philippine Passports3, Certificate of Completion for Elementary Education4, Secondary Student's Permanent Records5, College Official Transcript of Records6, National Bureau of Investigation Clearance7, National Police Clearance8, Certificate of Residence9, Barangay Identification Card10, Pag-IBIG Member's Data Form11, Overseas Filipino Worker Medical Card12, Medical Certificates13, Clinical Chemistry Reports14, Hematology Reports15, Radiologic Reports16, Radiographic Report17, Prescription Sheet18, and Personal Earnings and Benefit Estimate Statement 19.

On or around 2024, petitioner secured a copy of his Certificate of Live Birth from the respondent Philippine Statistics Authority and to his shock and dismay, he discovered that his date of birth and his sex/gender are erroneous. It appears in his Certificate of Live Birth that the petitioner's date of

birth is 16 August 1969, instead of 16 May 1970, which is his true and correct date of birth. It also appears in his Certificate of Live Birth that the petitioner's sex/gender is Female instead of Male which is his true and correct sex/gender. These erroneous entries are evidenced by the erroneous Certificate of Live Birth issued by the Philippine Statistics Authority²1.

9. Petitioner is bewildered by the fact that there are erroneous entries in his Certificate of Live Birth issued by the Philippine Statistics Authority considering that there were no erroneous entries when his mother, Leonida C. Marcelo, submitted to the Office of the Local Civil Registrar his Late Registration of Birth²¹. Further, when he secured a copy of his Certificate of Live Birth back in 2011 from the National Statistics Office, there were also no erroneous entries in his Certificate of Live Birth, as evidenced by a copy of his Certificate of Live Birth issued by the National Statistics

10. Upon learning the aforesaid erroneous entries in his Certificate of Live Birth issued by the respondent Philippine Statistics Authority, petitioner immediately filed a Petition for Correction of Clerical Error in the Certificate of Live Birth before the respondent Local Civil Registry Office of Porac, Pampanga, seeking correction of the clerical error in his Certificate of Live Birth, particularly Item Nos. four (4) and six (6), described as child's sex/gender and child's date of birth (month and day), from Female to Male and from 16 August to 16 May, respectively, as evidenced by a copy of the Petition for Correction of Clerical Error in the Certificate of Live Birth23.

11. On 28 June 2025, respondent Philippine Statistics Authority issued a copy of petitioner's Certificate of Live Birth containing an annotation for the correction of the erroneous entries of sex/ gender and the month of the date of birth of the petitioner, the annotation states:

PURSUANT TO THE DECISION RENDERED BY MCR EVA S. MANALASTAS-NUCUP DATED FEBRUARY 19, 2025 AND AFFIRMED BY CRG UNDER CROC NO. 25-2734723. THE CHILD'S SEX IS HEREBY CORRECTED TO "MALE"; AND THE CHILD'S DATE OF BIRTH IS LIKEWISE CORRECTED TO "MAY 16, 1969"."

as evidenced by a copy of the petitioner's Certificate of Live Birth? issued by the respondent Philippine Statistics Authority, dated 28 June 2025.

12. Petitioner is grateful that the erroneous entries for the sex/gender and month of his date of birth in his Certificate of Live Birth have been corrected. However, the entry for the year of his date of birth in his Certificate of Live Birth remains erroneous²1.

13. In the case of Dr. Ruben C. Bartolome vs Republic of the Philippines² the Supreme Court summarized the rules in Correction of Erroneous Entries, the Supreme Court held that:

In 2012, Republic Act No. 9048 was amended by Republic Act No. 10172.

In addition to the change of the first name, the day and month of birth, and the sex of a person may now be changed without judicial proceedings. Republic Act No. 10172 clarifies that these changes may now be administratively corrected where it is patently clear that there is a clerical or typographical mistake in the entry. It may be changed by filing a subscribed and sworn affidavit with the local civil registry office of the city or municipality where the record being sought to be corrected or changed is kept.

The foregoing rules may be summarized as follows:

1. A person seeking 1.) to change his or her first name, 2.) to correct clerical or typographical errors in the civil register, 3.) to change/correct the day and/or month of his or her date of birth, and/or 4.) to change/correct his or her sex, where it is patently clear that there was a clerical or typographical error or mistake, must first file a verified petition with the local civil registry office of the city or municipality where the record being sought to be corrected or changed is kept, in accordance with the administrative proceeding provided under R.A. 9048 in relation to R.A. 10172. A person may only avail of the appropriate judicial remedies under Rule 103 or Rule 108 if the aforementioned entries after the petition in the administrative proceedings is filed and later denied.

2. A person seeking 1.) to change his or her surname or 2.) to change both his or her first name and surname may file a petition for change of name under Rule 103, provided that the jurisprudential grounds discussed in Republic v. Hernandez are present.

3. A person seeking substantial cancellations or corrections of entries in the civil registry may file a petition for cancellation or correction of entries under Rule 108. As discussed in Lee v. Court of Appeals and more recently, in Republic v. Cagandahan, R.A. 9048 "removed from the ambit of Rule 108 of the Rules of Court the correction of such errors. Rule 108 now applies only to substantial changes and corrections in entries in the civil register. x x x" (emphasis ours)

14. Considering that the aforesaid erroneous entries includes an error in the year of the date of birth of the petitioner, such erroneous entry if substantial as shifting the birth year of the petitioner significantly alters his age. Thus, a petition for cancellation or correction of entries under Rule 108 is proper. Section 1 and 2 of Rule 108 of the Rules of Court states:

Cancellation or Correction of Entries in The Civil Registry

Section 1. Who may file petition. - Any person interested in any act, event, order or decree concerning the civil status of persons which has been recorded in the civil register, may file a verified petition for the cancellation or correction of any entry relating thereto, with the Court of First

Instance of the province where the corresponding civil registry is located."
26 Dr. Ruben C. Bartolome vs. Republic of the Philippines, G.r. No. 243288, 25 August 2019.

Section 2. Entries subject to cancellation or correction. – Upon good and valid grounds, the following entries in the civil register may be cancelled or corrected: (a) births; (b) marriage; (c) deaths; (d) legal separations; (e) judgments of marriage; (f) judgments declaring marriages void from the beginning; (g) legitimations (h) adoptions; (i) acknowledgments of natural children; (j) naturalization; (k) election, loss or recovery of citizenship; (I) civil interdiction (m) judicial determination of filiation; (n) voluntary emancipation of a minor; and (o) changes of name.

15. In view of the foregoing, petitioner humbly submits that there is a need for this Honorable Court to issue an Order to correct/cancel the erroneous entry in order to show the true facts of the petitioner's date of birth and to avoid confusion.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, premises considered, it is most respectfully prayed of unto this Honorable Court that, after due notice of publication and hearing, judgment be rendered granting this petition and consequently direct the respondents Philippine Statistics Authority and the Local Civil Registrar of Porac, Pampanga to make the necessary correction/cancellation on the Certificate of Live Birth of BERNADINE CUNANAN MARCELO [Annex "X" and series (Exhibit "X" and series)] pertaining to the year of his date of birth which is recorded as 1969 and change the same to 1970, which is the true and correct year on the date of birth of the petitioner.

Other reliefs, just and equitable under the premises, are likewise prayed for.

Finding the Petition to be sufficient in form and substance, the Court hereby sets the case for hearing on 26 JANUARY 2026 at two (2) o'clock in the afternoon. Other persons having or claiming any interest in this petition shall appear and show cause why, if any, the petition shall not be granted.

Pursuant to OCA Circular No. 108-2010 (Guidelines for the Temporary Replacement of Clerk of Court in the Handling of Case/s from which they are Disqualified under Section 1, Rule 137 of the Rules of Court, as amended), the parties and counsel(s) are hereby directed to file written manifestations, under oath, declaring as to whether or not they are related to the Branch Clerk of Court Atty. And we see the consequences everywhere. Where in the world do fishponds become garbage

pits? In the Philippines.

In Navotas, where leachate from these "unsanitary landfills" has poisoned aquaculture, killed livelihoods, and threatened food security. The sea that once fed our people is now choking with plastic washed down through our canals, creeks, and rivers by torrential rains into the ocean. We did this-to ourselves, to our neighbors, to our children.

We love to blame government, or corporations, or the informal waste sector. But the truth is harder: RA 9003 failed because we, as a nation, refused to change our daily habits. Because we did not have the discipline to segregate. Because too many LGUs opted for the easy way outhauling and dumping—as if "out of sight" meant "out of responsibility." Because corruption fattened itself on hauling contracts and tipping fees rather than investing in real waste reduction,

composting, and Materials Recovery Facilities.

This is one of the great ecological sins of our time. A sin not only against creation, but against the poor who suffer first from polluted water, poisoned fish, and floods worsened by canals clogged with our own negligence. A sin against future generations whose shores will be lined not with seashells, but with our plastic shame.

But guilt is not the ending.

Repentance is.

And repentance means change

Segregate from home. Demand that LGUs comply with RA 9003. Support recycling and composting. Stop treating the ocean as a bottomless pit. And start treating our country as the fragile, beautiful, irreplaceable archipelago that God entrusted to our care.

We can do better.

For the sake of the seas that surround us. the children who will inherit them, and the Creator who commanded us to "till and keep" His garden— we must do better.

just as vital, perhaps even existential.

Which means a linear, tactical approach to dealing with the nation's malaise may not be enough, not even meeting the objective of finishing 2028 successfully. Nation building is a continuum. His late father,a former dictator who once dreamed a of a new society, must have instilled that vision in him. Every now and then, the son, less than a disciple of Machiavelli, now repeats the idea, nowhere more emphatically than in his state -of- the- nation spiels.

The son may not be as cerebral, the sister senator showing she may have

guts, or so it seems, as a politician. But PBBM is calling the shots. Already in the saddle while the opponent is still on the stirrup, his father is wont to brag. He either calls them or shut up. He is also aware of the political slogan of keeping your enemies close, but your friends, perhaps even kin, closer. It can be said that he

played coy from the get go. He built and nurtured a playbook of awesome political unity that was thought to last. The regime in the remaking even breathed to keep a living monster alive, no matter what, notwithstanding its perceived crimes against the people. The right opportunities came when the other side, as expected, wanted more than it could chew, which is usually normal politics. Alas, the political appetite

shown it went beyond what was normal. There were threats to personal, family safety. There were hints of medical issues as a result of alleged drug use since power became heady for a former dictator family. Of late, n o less than a sibling, a sitting senator, sang the same song of addiction that runs through the family. Time to end the nightmare for the nation, so the drumbeat echoed.

What could be worse than a president who pretended to fight massive corruption but actually was behind all of it? What could be a better political showcase than luggages of billions in cash purportedly delivered to the doorstep of the highest official of the land?It could have ended in a triumphant spin of the wheel except the accuser was 10,000 miles away or so and would not, could not, come home to validate it.

Short of the failure, it would have created another opportunity for a nation to jettison another Marcos government for crime against its people. Waiting in the wings are the enemies-- former allies, in fact--of PBBM ready to spring a surprise, perhaps a civilian-military junta. But people know better.

Apparently, PBBM and his camp were prepared for it. Besides, others are watching how it will complicate the geopolitical status in the West Philippine Sea.

In fact, without this last important factor, there would have been a real change in the regime. No doubt, PBBM has played its cards well. The other side simply could not show theirs. In other words, it's a trump card we cannot bet on.

To drive home a point, historically, on the last date a huge rally was staged against corruption, the appeal by a former president for an interim release, against the charge of crime against humanity in the International Criminal Court, was totally junked. Some trolls even tried their luck at fake news by saying the dismissal was reversed. Before PBBM is able

to put corrupt legislators, public works engineers and contractors on Christmas Day, not necessarily in that order, the ICC shall determine if the former president is mentally fit for trial. Either way, the result would be a lost cause politically and morally for any effort for a regime change under PBBM. It's a cause for optimism in surviving the crucible. The nation may revel in his gift or grit as a leader whose time has really come. And what a time it is.
